# WHAT IS ONCA?



### WHAT IS ONCA?

- New corporate legislation governs Ontario not-for-profit corporations (NFPs)
- Replaces Ontario *Corporations Act* (**OCA**) for NFPs
- Came into force October 19, 2021 applied immediately
- Contains rules/requirements for how Ontario NFPs are to be structured/managed
  - Some different than OCA
- Modernized governance provisions
- New online system to make changes to documents filed with corporate ministry

# **REQUIREMENT TO TRANSITION UNDER ONCA**



### TRANSITIONING UNDER ONCA

- Current governing documents still valid/effective if complied with OCA
- Ontario NFPs have 3 years to transition under ONCA October 18, 2024 deadline
- Transition involves reviewing/updating governing documents to conform with ONCA
- If governing documents not updated by deadline, will be deemed to be amended
- RECOMMENDATION: All minor hockey associations incorporated as NFPs in Ontario (Associations) should review and update their governing documents to conform with ONCA by deadline

### General Overview and Process

- Locate Copies of Association's Governing Documents
  - Letters Patent: Document that incorporated Association contains name and purposes
  - Supplementary Letters Patent: Document that amended letters patent (may not be any)
  - *By-laws:* Document containing governance rules such as member qualifications, director elections, member/director meeting protocols
  - Special Resolutions: Resolutions passed by <sup>2</sup>/<sub>3</sub> vote of members such as to change number of directors
- What if Cannot Locate Governing Documents?
  - Letters Patent/Supplementary Letters Patent can be ordered from corporate ministry for nominal fee
  - By-laws/Special Resolutions: Should prepare new ONCA compliant by-law and repeal all previous bylaws/special resolutions

### General Overview and Process

- Determine if Association is Public Benefit Corporation (PBC)
  - Ontario NFP that receives more than \$10,000 in financial year in donations/gifts from nonmembers/directors/officers/employees of Association, or grants/similar financial assistance from government
- Review and Update Governing Documents
  - Any outdated/inapplicable provisions?
  - Any provisions that do not comply with ONCA?

Steps Following Review and Update of Governing Documents:

- **Step 1** Directors approve ONCA-compliant Governing Documents
- Step 2 Members approve ONCA-compliant Governing Documents
- Step 3 Ensure have online access to Ontario Business Registry (OBR)
- **Step 4** Ensure corporate filings up-to-date
- Step 5 File articles of amendment and restated articles with corporate ministry
- **Step 6** Review and update other governance documents and policies

# **KEY CONSIDERATIONS – GOOD GOVERNANCE**

### **GOVERNING DOCUMENTS**

Letters Patent

- **Review**: Consider if provisions continue to be applicable, comply with ONCA
- Filing: Prepare/file articles with corporate ministry to update letters patent and bring them into compliance with ONCA
- Articles of Amendment: Only reflect <u>changes</u> made to letters patent
- **Restated Articles of Incorporation**: Consolidate into new document unamended provisions from letters patent and provisions added by articles of amendment

## **GOVERNING DOCUMENTS: LETTERS PATENT**

### **ONCA** Considerations: Articles of Amendment

- **Registered Office:** Ensure current address on record with ministry before filing articles
- Number of Directors: Consider use of range provides flexibility without need for future amendments
- Purposes: Do they reflect current/ anticipated activities; consult legal counsel if considering changing purposes/activities
- **Powers Clauses:** Powers and privileges of natural person; consider restrictions

- Membership Structure: Classes of members; voting rights
- **Dissolution:** What will happen to assets upon dissolution?
- Voting Thresholds: Increased thresholds must be in articles
- **Special Provisions:** Borrowing; commercial purposes

### **GOVERNING DOCUMENTS: BY-LAWS**

### **ONCA** Considerations: Directors and Officers

- Number of directors: Minimum/maximum vs. fixed
- **Director qualifications**: Consider including vulnerable sector screening check; *ex officio*?
- Election of directors: Advance notice of nominations?
- Consent to act as director: Get signed consent
- **Removal of director**: Default is majority vote of members; cannot be increased
- Term of office: Term lengths; staggered terms; reelection
- **Director ceases to hold office**: Consider automatic cessation if fail to meet qualifications
- Filling vacancy: Who should fill?

- **Directors' meetings**: How and when should be called and held?; no substitutes
- Electronic meetings: Can be held partially/fully electronically
- Officers: Chair requirement
- **Conflicts of interest**: Disclosure of "material contract or transaction"; recusal; other rules
- Indemnification and insurance: Include clause?
- **Delegation of directors' duties**: Permitted with limits

## **GOVERNING DOCUMENTS: BY-LAWS**

### **ONCA** Considerations: Members

- Member rights: Enhanced rights, including protections
- **Types of membership**: Member qualifications; can corporations be members?
- Members' meetings: Annual vs. special; notice (special business); quorum

- Electronic meetings/alternative voting methods: fully/partially electronically; voting by proxy
- Discipline and termination of membership: Circumstances; use of policy
- Fundamental changes: Special resolution to approve

## **GOOD GOVERNANCE CONSIDERATIONS**

General Comments

- Only minor adjustments to by-laws may be required
  - If not, may be more expedient/cost-effective to replace current by-laws with new ONCA-compliant bylaws
- Provide sufficient time to transition estimated timeline to complete transition 6-12 months (transition deadline: <u>October 18, 2024)</u>
